## Supply list

Easel

- French easel or portable setup for walking around town.


These are the most common designs.

## Paints

- My palette has titanium white, lemon yellow, cadmium yellow, indian yellow, cadmium red, alizarin crimson, ultramarine blue, cerulean blue, burnt umber, burnt sienna.
- You may bring colors of your choosing, but at the very least, you must have a limited primary range, such as: titanium white, ultramarine blue, cadmium red, cadmium yellow, burnt umber or Vandyke brown.
- If you are still getting comfortable with color (or you're on a budget), I strongly recommend using a limited color palette. I promise you will not feel for lack of color, and you will appreciate the efficiency of mixing.
- Don't forget your linseed oil and odorless mineral spirits, and glass or metal containers for them if working in oils-water if you work in acrylics or watercolor.



## Brushes

A variety of brushes with a minimum of three flat bristle brushes ranging sizes 1-6 and a couple sables/synthetics for artists using oils.


## Painting surfaces

- In accordance with your medium canvas/linen, board, paper.

Sizes: your preference between $8 \times 10$ " and $18 \times 20$ "
Note:
Antwan primarily paints on gesso board or on linen panels.
For watercolor I prefer Arches 140-300 cold press.


## Palette and palette knife

Palette knife: preferably metal for mixing paint.
Most likely a palette will be a part of your set up. Shape doesn't matter, just somewhere ample to layout and mix paints.


Sketchbook
(preferably larger than 6x8) and pencil/charcoal/greyscale markers.

## Paper towels

- Small plastic bag for trash.

Other things you may want to bring:

- Hat
- Rain jacket
- Water
- Chair
- Sunscreen
